conversation included a discussion regarding the proposed construction at 980 Middlefield (old funeral home), our current construction project, how the construction is impacting day-to-day operations, traffic/ safety/ parking, and field trip funds. Along with the Principal Coffees, I'm always available to hear your thoughts and questions regarding school so feel free to email me or stop me on campus before or after school.


